Located on the Las Vegas strip at the much admired Circus Circus Hotel, it offers tremendous entertainment value to visitors with its 25 rides, roller coasters, rock climbing wall, and an arcade. Traveling through the city, you can also visit the world-famous Madame Tussauds, the interactive wax museum that houses real-looking wax models of celebrity figures.
